- Winter Term: February 1-May 3, 2025 (Winter/Spring Term) (No Program Feb 14, Mar 8, 15, and April 19) (10 weeks)
- Compensation: \$1,300 contract

##### **March Break Math Literacy**

- Monday - Friday, 9am - 3pm
- Compensation: \$875 contract

### **LEAP into Literacy Summer Camp**

- Compensation: \$830 per week x 4 weeks

Our programs ignite, accelerate and provide a bridge to academic and personal success.

#### **Duties and Responsibilities:**

- Attend pre-program training sessions and staff meetings.
- Plan and implement weekly literacy and/or math programs tailored to students' needs.
- Work with two small groups of students for designated session times.
- Prepare students for the Community Showcase to share their progress.
- Collaborate with high school and adult volunteers to establish effective teaching support and supervision.
- Maintain a positive, safe, and engaging learning environment.
- Administer literacy- or math-based assessments and student surveys as required.
- Complete end-of-program evaluations and surveys.
- Adhere to and sign the LiftED Communication and Behaviour policies.
- Must attend at least 80% of scheduled sessions.

#### **Qualifications:**

- Ontario Certified Teacher (OCT) certification is required.
- Strong passion for and commitment to supporting youth in their educational journey.
- Demonstrated ability to inspire and motivate children in an after-school or camp setting.
- Creative, enthusiastic, and responsible personality with a focus on fostering positive learning experiences.
- Experience working with diverse populations, including multicultural and low-income communities.
- Current vulnerable sector police check (required before program start).
- Familiarity with the community where the program is run is considered an asset.
